This morning's vote in House Education was postponed until 5 PM today – Keep calling and emailing the <u>House Education Committee</u> to voice your opposition to HB 2425, which basically extends the working hours of service personnel without additional compensation.

<u>HB 4022</u> Clarifying the qualifications of the Chancellor of the Higher Education Policy Commission; passed House, pending Senate Education

<u>HB 4077</u> Increasing the amount of the bond required to be posted by proprietary schools; passed House, communicated to Senate

<u>HB 4365</u> Granting of college credit hours for learning English as a second language; on 1st reading in House

HB 4089 Requiring cursive writing to be taught; on 1st reading on special calendar

HB 4143 Creating the Business PROMISE+ Scholarship; pending House Finance

Comm Sub for <u>HB 2464</u> Requiring free feminine hygiene products in grades 6 through 12; pending Finance

Comm Sub for <u>HB 2433</u> Modifying the school calendar to begin not earlier than Labor Day and end prior to Memorial Day; pending House Finance

Bills Advanced out of Senate Education:

<u>SB 42</u> Permitting faith-based electives in classroom drug prevention programs; passed full Senate, pending House Education

Comm Sub for <u>SB 187</u> Relating generally to in-state tuition rates for certain persons; pending Senate Finance

Comm Sub for <u>SB 192</u> Relating to WV Secondary School Activities Commission audits; on 3rd reading in Senate

Comm Sub for <u>SB 297</u> Requiring Board of Education create home economics course; on 3rd reading in Senate

Comm Sub for SB 303 Enacting Students' Right to Know Act; on 1st reading in Senate
