Quiet session for education concludes, focus now turns to 2020 election



The 2020 Legislative Session has concluded, and while we are grateful to have escaped the major attacks of the past two years, many critical issues still need addressed.

PEIA is still the biggest unresolved issue for our members. While the plan is currently stable, we know that the future stability is uncertain. Our

elected leaders must find a permanent funding stream as well as ensure PEIA provides high quality benefit levels for participants.

The most important takeaway from this legislative session is simple; educators must pay attention to the priorities and voting records of current legislators and vote accordingly in May and November. Only by electing candidates who support our issues and are committed to improving public education will we be able to move our profession, our students and our state forward.
